

RESULTS FROM GENFORWARD -- A NATIONALLY REPRESENTATIVE SURVEY OF YOUNG PEOPLE AGE 18-30 TAKEN DECEMBER 9-26 BY THE BLACK YOUTH PROJECT WITH THE AP-NORC CENTER...

✓ **Many young adults of all races and ethnicities believe the lives of people of color will become worse with Trump's election and the lives of whites will improve**

- About 2 in 3 African Americans, Asian Americans, and Latino/as say both the lives of people of color will get worse and the lives of whites will improve under a Trump administration
- About half of whites believe both the lives of people of color will become worse and the lives of whites will improve
- African Americans, Asian Americans, and Latino/as are more likely to believe they personally will be worse off than better off in four years while whites are divided

✓ **Whites are more likely than other racial and ethnic groups to say Trump's election will improve the lives of the middle class and working class**

- About 4 in 10 whites report Trump will improve the lives of the middle class compared to about 2 in 10 African Americans, Asian Americans, and Latino/as


✓ **Across races and ethnicities, many expect the lives of women and poor people will become worse**

- Majorities of African Americans, Asian Americans, and Latino/as believe the lives of both women and poor people will become worse with Trump's election while nearly half of whites say the same about both groups

✓ **Many young adults of all races and ethnicities expect Trump to repeal Obamacare, cut taxes for the rich, enrich his family and friends, and deport millions of undocumented immigrants**

% who say ...




Question: How likely is Donald Trump to do the following as president?

✓ **Most young adults of all races and ethnicities are skeptical that Trump will defeat ISIS, "drain the swamp" of traditional politicians and lobbyists, cut taxes for the middle class, or build a wall along the Mexican border**

Question: How likely is Donald Trump to do the following as president?

✓ **Young adults of different races and ethnicities identify slightly different problems for Trump to address**

- African Americans are most likely to say the key problems are race relations (30 percent), jobs/unemployment (18 percent), and uniting Americans (18 percent)
- Asian Americans are most likely to say the key problems are health care (23 percent), race relations (22 percent), and the economy (21 percent)
- Latino/as are most likely to say the key problems are immigration (33 percent), terrorism (21 percent), and race relations (19 percent)
- Whites are most likely to say the key problems are health care (27 percent), the economy (22 percent), and immigration (17 percent)

✓ **Many young adults, especially those of color, do not believe Trump will go down in history as a great president**

- About 2 in 3 Latino/as, African Americans, and Asian Americans say Trump will be remembered as a not very good or poor president while half of whites say the same
- Whites (10 percent) are more likely to say Trump will go down as a great president than Asian Americans (5 percent), Latino/as (4 percent), and African Americans (2 percent)

Results are from GenForward, a survey of the Black Youth Project at the University of Chicago with The AP-NORC Center, with a nationally representative sample of 1,823 adults 18-30 years old. Interviews were completed online and using landlines and cellphones from December 9-26, 2016. Results have a margin of sampling error of +/- 4.0 percentage points.
