Findings about Politics

- When young adults are asked what the **most important issue facing the country today** is, we find that the coronavirus is most often listed as the most important issue, but its placement in the list of issues matter.
 - When the coronavirus pandemic is placed at the top of the list of issues, majorities of African American (58%), Asian American (70%), Latinx (64%) and white (69%) young adults chose the coronavirus pandemic as the most important problem facing the country.
 - When the coronavirus pandemic is scattered randomly among other issues pluralities of Asian (43%), Latinx (36%), African American (37%) and white (37%) young adults all indicate that the **coronavirus pandemic is the most important problem facing the country today**. The second most popular choice among young adults across race and ethnicity is health care.
- A majority of Asian (53%) respondents and near majorities of African American (45%), Latinx (47%), and white (48%) young adults believe that **the United States is either already in or headed to an economic recession**.
- Pluralities of young adults—32% of African American, 32% of Latinx, 33% of White and 34% of Asian Americans—**believe that the United States is headed to an economic depression**.
- More African American (50%) and Latinx (47%) young adults **are extremely or very worried about being able to pay an unexpected bill of \$1,000 right away** compared to 41% of white and 33% of Asian young adults.
- Across race and ethnicity, pluralities of young adults **prefer Senator Sanders over former VP. Biden**. When asked if they would vote for Senator Sanders, VP Biden, or someone else in their state's primaries, 44% of African American, 44% of Asian, 47% of Latinx, and 35% of white young adults preferred Senator Sanders.
- Majorities of African American (68%), Asian (58%) and Latinx (51%) young adults **believe that Trump will lose re-election in 2020**. However, 59% of white young adults believe that Trump will win re-election.
- When asked who they would vote for if the general election was held today between Donald Trump and Joe Biden, clear majorities of African American (84%), Asian (77%) and Latinx (68%) young adults say they prefer Joe Biden. In contrast, young whites split their vote with 48% supporting Trump and 51% supporting Biden.
- Majorities of African American (59%) and Asian (65%) young adults somewhat or strongly **disapprove of the way that Donald Trump is handling his job as president**. This is compared to pluralities of Latinx (49%) and white (46%) young adults who disapprove.

Findings about the Coronavirus Pandemic

- Pluralities of Asian (40%), Latinx (38%), and white (43%) of young adults believe that **their local government is doing a good job in response to the coronavirus pandemic**. This is compared to a plurality of African American (35%) young adults who believe **their local government is doing a fair job**.
- Majorities and near majorities of Asian (61%), white (57%) and Latinx (49%) young adults **believe their state government is doing an excellent or good job in response to the coronavirus pandemic**. Pluralities of these young adults said their state was doing a good job in responding. In contrast, 42% of African American young adults believed their state was doing an excellent or good job in responding to the pandemic with pluralities rating their state's response as fair.
- Majorities of young adults across race **believe that the federal government's response to the coronavirus pandemic is either fair or poor**. Specifically, 63% of white, 67% of Latinx, 78% of Asian, and 71% of African American respondents believe the federal government response to be fair or poor.
- Majorities of Asian (63%), African American (57%) and Latinx (53%) young adults and a plurality (43%) of white young adults **rate President Donald Trump's response to the coronavirus pandemic as poor**.
- Majorities of young adults across race and ethnicity think **public health officials are doing an excellent or good job** in responding to the coronavirus pandemic—African American (54%), Asian (60%), Latinx (60%) and white (67%).
- Between coronavirus information provided by local, state, and federal governments, **young adults trust information from the federal government the least**. Pluralities of young adults across race and ethnicity say they trust information from their local or state governments a good amount. In contrast, only Latinx and white young adults say they trust information from the federal government a good amount. Pluralities of African American and Asian young adults say they trust information from the federal government not very much.
- **Coronavirus information from President Donald Trump is rarely trusted by young adults**. A majority of African American respondents (52%) and pluralities of Asian (45%), Latinx(41%) and white (36%) respondents indicate that they do not trust information coming from President Trump at all.
- Pluralities of young adults across race and ethnicity indicate **they trust information from public health experts on the coronavirus a good amount**. Specifically, 38% of African American, 44% of Asian, 46% of Latinx, and 43% of white young adults indicate that they trust public health official's information a good amount.

- Pluralities of African American (33%), Latinx (38%) and white (43%) young adults indicate that they trust the **information about the coronavirus from the news media not very much**. Pluralities of Asian young adults (42%) say they trust the information from the news media a good amount.
- Majorities of Asian (60%) and white (50%) and pluralities of African American (47%) and Latinx (48%) young adults **believe that the media is paying the exact right amount of attention to the coronavirus**.
- Pluralities of young adults—(39%) African American, (38%) Asian, (33%) Latinx, and (35%) white—**believe that the news media has gotten the risk about right**. However, about a quarter of Asian (24%), Latinx (26%), and white (26%) young adults believe that the media is **slightly exaggerating the risks**, while **22% of African American young adults believe the media is greatly exaggerating the risks of the pandemic**.
- Majorities of young adults across race and ethnicity indicate they have been following the news about the coronavirus pandemic very or fairly closely. Their top three trusted news sites are television nightly news programs (27%), traditional print and online newspapers (17%) and social networking sites such as Facebook and Twitter (17%).
- **Young African American adults (30%)** are slightly more likely than Asian (24%), Latinx (25%) and white (24%) young adults to say that **either they or someone they know have tested positive for coronavirus**.
- **Young African American adults (23%)** are more likely than Asian (13%), Latinx (18%) and white (12%) **to have either been hospitalized themselves or know someone that has been hospitalized because of the coronavirus**.
- **Young African American adults (32%)** are more likely than Asian (27%), Latinx (26%) and white (19%) young adults to indicate **they are very concerned about getting seriously sick due to the coronavirus**. Ironically, they are also the group most likely to indicate they are not concerned at all about getting seriously sick—African American (12%), Asian (8%), Latinx (7%) and white (10%).
- Majorities of all young adults across race and ethnicity indicate 1) they are **very concerned or concerned about getting seriously sick due to the coronavirus**; 2) **very concerned or concerned that someone in their family will get sick**; 3) **are very worried or worried about spreading the coronavirus to family and friends and other people**; and 4) **very worried or worried that hospitals and medical centers in their area will not be able to handle the medical needs of people who are seriously ill during the coronavirus pandemic**.
- Majorities of young adults believe the pandemic is a major threat to the health of the US population, while a plurality of African American (47%), Asian (47%) and Latinx (45%) believe the pandemic is a **major threat to their personal health**. A majority of young white adults (55%) believe the pandemic is a **minor threat to their personal health**.

- While majorities of all young adults believe the pandemic is a major threat to the US economy, majorities of Latinx (62%), African American (58%), and Asian (58%) young and a plurality (44%) of white young adults also agree that the **coronavirus pandemic is a major threat to their personal financial situation.**
- Majorities of young adults across race and ethnicity indicate that neither them nor anyone in their household has been laid off or lost a job because of the pandemic. Specifically, 58% of African American, 67% of Asian, 51% of Latinx, and 64% of white respondents indicate neither they nor someone in their household has been laid off or lost their job.
- Majorities of African American (56%), Asian (62%), white (59%) and a plurality of Latinx (45%) young adults indicate that no one in their household had to take a cut in pay due to reduced hours or demand for work.
- Pluralities of young adults indicate that the COVID-19 pandemic has had moderate impact on their economic situation—37% of African American, 34% of Asian, 40% of Latinx, and 37% of white respondents.
- Near majorities of Asian (44%), Latinx (46%) and white (46%) young adults compared to 37% of African American young adults say that the COVID-19 pandemic has had moderate impact on their own emotions.
- The word young adults most often cited as best describing their feelings in the wake of the COVID-19 pandemic was **anxiety**. Specifically, 15% of African American, 23% of Latinx, 26% of white, and 29% of Asian young adults choose anxious to describe their feelings. The next most chosen words were **unsure** followed by **frustrated**.
- Pluralities of African American (38%), Asian (45%), Latinx (42%) and white (42%) young adults agree with the statement “I am just trying to make it through the pandemic, so I cannot be involved in volunteer work right now.” The second most supported statement was “I am seeing how other people are working hard to respond to this crisis and feel inspired by their work and wish I was doing more.”
- Many young adult respondents **believe that too many young people have contributed significantly to the spread of the virus by disregarding social distancing.** Pluralities of white (42%) and Latinx (47%) along with 43% of African American and Asian American young adults strongly agree that young people disregarded the requirements for social distancing.
- Majorities of Asian (57%) and white (51%) young adults and pluralities of African American (42%) and Latinx (44%) **believe that life will be back to normal in about 3 months to one year.**
- Among students, a majority of African American (57%), Asian (63%), Latinx (57%), and white (55%) young adults say they are concerned or very concerned that the coronavirus pandemic **will make it more difficult to finish their degree.**

- Majorities of young adults across race and ethnicity—68% of white, 68% of African American, 70% of Latinx, and 77% of Asian young adults—**believe that the negative effects from the coronavirus are more likely impact poor people**. When the question is asked about the impact of the coronavirus on people of color, 27% of white, 31% of Latinx, 36% of African American, and 56% of Asian young adults believe that the negative from the coronavirus **will more likely impact people of color**.
- Almost **one-third (32%) of Asian young adults indicated that they have recently experienced discrimination because of their race or ethnicity**. This is higher than the percentage of African American (28%), Latinx (20%), and white (9%) young adults who have indicated that they have recently experienced discrimination.
- Majorities of Latinx (61%), African American (63%), and Asian (73%) **respondents believe that Pres. Trump calling the coronavirus the “Chinese virus” is racist**. However, 53% of white respondents believe that **it is not racist**.
- Across race, pluralities of young adults **believe that corporations will most benefit from the government bailout authorized to help reduce the negative impact from the coronavirus**. Specifically, 37% of African American, 39% of Latinx, 40% of white, and 44% of Asian young adults indicated corporations will benefit most.
- When asked if the government should have an obligation to take care of people whose jobs are displaced by the coronavirus pandemic, majorities of young adult African American (62%), Asian (59%), and Latinx (52%) respondents as well as a plurality of white (45%) strongly agree.
 - When the caveat is attached indicating that this would raise taxes substantially, pluralities of young adults somewhat agree. Specifically, 39% of African American, 41% of Asian, 40% of Latinx, and 42% of white young adults responded that they somewhat agree.
- Substantial majorities of young adults across partisanship somewhat or strongly support a **universal basic income benefit of \$1,000 each month for each American 18 or older** (82% African American, 79% Asian, 77% Latinx, and 73% of white young adults).
- Pluralities of Asian (34%), Latinx (33%), and white (33%) say their preferred form of health care expansion would be **establishing a public option like Medicare-for-all but letting people stay on their private insurance if they want to**. However, a plurality of African American (30%) indicate they want to keep and build on the existing Affordable Care Act.
- Some states and localities have taken **a number of measures to address the coronavirus pandemic**. Respondents were asked to indicate whether they agree or disagree with the policy during the pandemic only or with the policy even after the pandemic. We asked respondents about the following five policies:

- **Stopping landlords from evicting tenants:** 55% of African Americans, 68% of Asian, 59% of Latinx, and 72% of white young adults agree with the policy during the pandemic
 - 30% of African American, 20% of Asian, 26% of Latinx, and 16% of white respondents agree with the policy even after the pandemic.
- **Stopping the repayment of student loans:** 43% of African Americans, 56% of Asian, 50% of Latinx, and 59% of white young adults agree with the policy during the pandemic
 - 42% of African American, 32% of Asian, 35% of Latinx, and 29% of white respondents agree with the policy even after the pandemic.
- **Releasing those incarcerated for non-violent crimes:** 39% of African Americans, 35% of Asian, 31% of Latinx, and 32% of white young adults agree with the policy during the pandemic
 - 33% of African American, 26% of Asian, 23% of Latinx, and 24% of white respondents agree with the policy even after the pandemic.
- **Stop the cutoff of utilities such as water and electricity:** 48% of African Americans, 57% of Asian, 53% of Latinx, and 64% of white young adults agree with the policy during the pandemic
 - 35% of African American, 27% of Asian, 27% of Latinx, and 23% of white respondents agree with the policy even after the pandemic.
- **U.S. Immigrations and Customs Enforcement (ICE) releasing *all immigrants* in US immigrant detention centers:** 32% of African Americans, 32% of Asian, 32% of Latinx, and 27% of white young adults agree with the policy during the pandemic
 - 39% of African American, 40% of Asian, 38% of Latinx, and 31% of white respondents agree with the policy even after the pandemic.
- **U.S. Immigrations and Customs Enforcement (ICE) releasing *immigrants at risk for COVID-19* in US immigrant detention centers:** 41% of African Americans, 37% of Asian, 32% of Latinx, and 35% of white young adults agree with the policy during the pandemic
 - 35% of African American, 36% of Asian, 35% of Latinx, and 23% of white respondents agree with the policy even after the pandemic.
